Quizmaster notes

On behalf of Leonard Cheshire thank you for taking on the role of Quizmaster for this charity quiz. These notes are designed to help with the smooth running of the quiz. We hope you have an enjoyable event.

Preparation

- Some spare pens in case teams don't have one.
- Use the enclosed donation box to collect the donations.
- Check how to use the microphone.
- The suggested donation is £3.00 per participant.

Format

- There are 6 rounds of 10 questions, plus a picture round.
- When collecting the donations, hand out an answer sheet and the picture round sheet to each team. (10 answer sheets and picture round sheets are provided as part of this pack). They can start working on the picture round while you are setting up.
- The usual format is to have 3 rounds and then have a short break (to allow comfort breaks and people to grab a drink) and then complete the final 3 rounds. Each block of 3 rounds usually takes around 45 minutes.
- You can score the first 3 rounds and picture round at the end of the half time break. Alternatively, you can wait and score the full quiz at the end.

Introduction

"Welcome to the (INSERT NAME) quiz on behalf of Leonard Cheshire – one of the UK's leading charities supporting disabled people".

Explain:

- The format and timings.
- The scoring system.
- Prizes (how many, how much).
- Remind them to put their team name on both the answer sheet and picture round.
- If you think it is necessary, remind people not to use their mobile phones.

During the quiz

- Read out the question number before each question.
- If you are unsure about any pronunciations, spell out the word.
- You should ask at the end of each round if there are any questions which need repeating.
- Depending on the quality of the audio system you may need to take a quick tour round the venue at the half time break and at the end to check if anyone has any queries.

Scoring

Ask the teams to swap their answer sheets with another team for marking.

- Read out each question followed by the answer.
- For some answers, Quizmaster notes have been provided to give the audience additional detail about the answer.
- Each correct answer scores one point.
- Use your discretion over misspelt answers. Usually they are fine as long as they are close to the answer.
- The most important rule: The Quizmaster is always right.
- Collect all the answer sheets at the end and order them according to the total score. It is traditional to read out the results in reverse order.
- If you have a tie for any of the prizes, a couple of tie-break questions have been provided.

Tie-break process

- The answer to the tie-break question is a number. The winning team will be the one that gets closest to the correct answer.
- Ask the teams involved in the tie-break to write down their answer and then bring it to you.
- On the very rare occasion when the teams give the same answer or are the same distance away from the correct answer, there is a second tie-break question to separate them.
